The Organ Music in Today's Liturgy

The first consideration for registration (the process of combining pipes to create a composite sound) is the type of pipe to choose: principal, flute, string, or reed. The second consideration is the pitch level. The "stops" of an organ each control a set of pipes (a "rank") of a type and pitch level. An 8' rank sounds at unison; so, for instance, the key A around the middle of the keyboard has a frequency of 440 cycles per second in an 8' rank. For a 4' rank, that same A would have a frequency of 880 cps; that A with a 2' rank would sound a 1760 cps, and for a 16' rank would sound at 220 cps. 4' and 2' ranks add brightness to the sound, and during Lent, to create a more somber sound, the 2' pipes and certain 4' pipes are being excluded from registrations. If you would like to know more, please ask Joseph Schubert, the organist.
