Sunday Reflection

“He walked with them.”

Friends, today’s Gospel brings us to a dusty road outside Jerusalem, where two disciples walk with heavy hearts. They are confused, disappointed, grieving. Everything they hoped for seems lost. They are going home not because they found answers, but because they ran out of strength to keep searching. And it is there, on that road of discouragement, that Jesus comes to meet them. Not in the Temple, not in a moment of triumph, not when they are full of faith, but when they are walking away. This is the first great truth of today’s Gospel: **God meets us where we are, not where we think we should be.** He meets us in confusion, in disappointment, in fear, in the quiet moments when we’re not even sure we’re praying. He meets us on the road we’re actually walking, not the one we wish we were on.

On this road of disappointment, confusion and frustration, the apostles didn’t plan to meet Jesus. They didn’t expect anything holy to happen. They were just trying to get home before dark. And then this “stranger” shows up. To be honest, He probably felt like an inconvenience to them. They were grieving, very exhausted and trying so hard to process everything that had happened. And now a stranger interrupts their conversation and asks questions. If they had been in a different mood, they might have brushed Him off or if they had been too wrapped up in their own pain, they might have missed Him entirely. But they didn’t. They let the interruption become an encounter, and that’s when everything changed.

This is one of the quiet truths of the spiritual life: **God rarely arrives on our schedule. He rarely appears in the form we expect. He often comes disguised as an inconvenience.** It could be a phone call when we’re busy. A person who needs help when we’re tired. A conversation we didn’t plan to have. A delay that frustrates us. A moment that slows us down. But what if like the stranger on the road these are the very places where Christ is drawing near? What if the “inconvenience” is actually the doorway through which God is making Himself known? **The disciples only recognized Him because they made room for the interruption.** If they had said, “we’re tired... we just want to be alone... maybe tomorrow... maybe another time...” If they had let Him keep walking, they would have missed the moment that opened their eyes. They would have missed the breaking of the bread. They would have missed the revelation of the Risen Christ. They would have missed the fire that sent them running back to Jerusalem with joy. What looked like an inconvenience on the road to Emmaus turned out to be the moment of revelation. Sometimes the interruptions in our lives are the very places where Christ is trying to meet us.

If you come to think about it, this is how Mass works too, every Sunday, God interrupts our week. We stop what we’re doing, we step away from our routines, we pause our plans. And sometimes let’s be honest Mass can feel like an inconvenience. But it is precisely in that holy interruption that Christ walks with us, opens the Scriptures to us, breaks the bread for us, and reveals Himself again. The Eucharist is that moment when the “stranger” becomes our Savior.

Every encounter with Christ always ends in mission. Even for us we ought to be people who say, “Stay with us, Lord.” And then to become people who bring Him to others: the discouraged, the lonely, the confused and those who are grieving. Our mission is to walk with others the way Christ walks with us, patiently, gently, listening first, and loving always.
