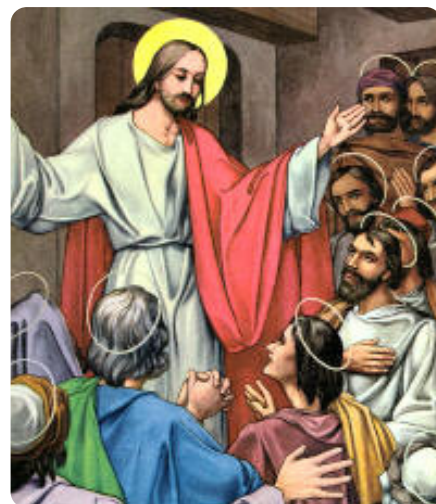

Sunday Reflection

“Do not let your hearts be troubled.”

Friends, Jesus spoke these words on the night of the Last Supper, when everything around the disciples was falling apart. Judas had left to betray Him, Peter had been told he was going to deny Him and the cross was only hours away. That room was thick with fear, confusion, and the sense that life was slipping out of control. And into that moment, Jesus spoke words that sounds almost impossible: “*Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me.*” Simply put, in this passage, Jesus comforts his disciples before his passion. He invites trust, offers presence, and commissions his followers to continue his work.

If we are very observant about things, the world today feels a lot like that upper room. People are anxious about the future, families are stretched thin, communities feel divided, the news is heavy, the world is desperate for reassurance, for stability, for hope. So today, like back then in the upper room, Jesus speaks into our moment the same words: “*Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me.*” He does not speak from a distance; he speaks from the heart of God who is with us. He speaks them to the parent worried about a child. To the person carrying grief that no one sees. To the one who feels overwhelmed by responsibilities. To the young persons unsure of their path. To the elderly person who feels alone. To the one praying for peace in a world that seems to know only conflict. Jesus speaks these words to you, right now, in whatever you are carrying. And he does so not as a distant God shouting encouragement from far away, but as the God who sits beside you, who knows your story, who walks with you, and holds you.

At the end of this Gospel passage, Jesus further says something astonishing: “*Whoever believes in me will do the works that I do and will do greater ones than these.*” Greater ones, not because we are powerful, but because He is with us. Jesus comforts us, and then He commissions us. He says: “*You have heard Me say, ‘Do not let your hearts be troubled.’ Now go and say those words to the world,*” because the world is desperate for someone to echo Christ’s voice. The world needs disciples who carry this message. There are people right now who are overwhelmed, afraid, or discouraged. People who feel like the disciples in that upper room.

Today Jesus sends us to them, not so much to preach to them, but to be a living reminder that God is close to them in all their dark valleys. We may not calm storms with a word, but we can calm a heart with our kindness. We may not raise the dead, but we can raise someone’s spirit. We may not multiply loaves, but we can multiply hope. This you do every time you reassure a child, every time you sit with someone who is grieving, every time you choose compassion over anger, every time you pray for peace in a violent world, every time you remind someone, “You’re not alone...” You echo the voice of Jesus, you become His presence and you become the “dwelling place” where others encounter God. Your presence can truly reveal God’s presence. You may be the doorway through which someone discovers that Christ is still speaking, still comforting, and still guiding. Because the world is aching for a voice that steadies, a presence that reassures, a hope that does not fade, may we be that presence, may we echo His peace and carry His promise into every troubled heart we meet.
