UNITY, NOT UNIFORMITY

In the preceding weeks, the history of how God saved humanity unfolded before us: The Father sends the Son, and the Father and Son send the Holy Spirit. Now, with all three Persons fully revealed to the world, the Church pauses. Having concluded the Easter season, Trinity Sunday acts as a bridge into Ordinary Time. It reminds us that the everyday mission of the Church must flow from, and return to, the communal love of the Triune God. When we look at the Holy Trinity, our focus should not be a theological puzzle about hierarchical arrangement or how three distinct persons mathematically equal one. Instead, we are called to contemplate how the three Persons operate and work in perfect harmony.

This is exactly what the second reading implores us to emulate in our Christian communities: "Mend your ways, encourage one another, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you."

When a choir sings in unison, everyone sings the exact same note and tone. It is precise, but it can be rigid, and those who struggle to hit that exact note feels out of place. But when a choir sings in harmony, different voices; soprano, alto, tenor, and bass sing completely different notes. Yet, when blended, these distinct voices create a piece of music that is incredibly beautiful, rich, and moving.

Living in harmony does not mean we lose our unique personalities, backgrounds, charisms, or roles. It means we coordinate our diverse gifts to work beautifully together for the glory of God.

We see this perfect harmony clearly in how the Trinity handles "Truth": The Father is the Speaker. He utters, reveals, and declares the truth. The Son is the Word. He is the Truth itself; "I am the way, the truth, and the life." The Holy Spirit is the Illuminator. He is the Spirit of Truth who makes the Son's truth understandable, real, and transformative in our lives. Notice how desperately they need one another to accomplish the mission: If you remove the Father (the Speaker), there is no Word spoken and nothing to reveal. If you remove the Son (the Truth), the Speaker has nothing to say and the Spirit has nothing to illuminate. If you remove the Holy Spirit (the Illuminator), the truth is spoken, but it remains a mystery unheard, misunderstood, and powerless in our hearts.

All three Persons retain their distinct identities, yet they work in total, seamless cooperation to deliver salvation to mankind.

If the Holy Trinity requires this harmony to reveal God's love, how much more does our parish and the global Catholic Church need it? The newly born Church, emerging from the fires of Pentecost, is being shown a grand truth today: A divided Church cannot convince a broken world. We do not need to look alike, think alike, or possess the same talents to be one.

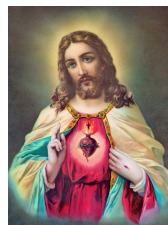

Next week, we conclude what are generally termed the "High Holy Days" of Easter, and we will enter Ordinary Time, and stay there until the end of the church year in November. In Ordinary Time, the Church's music often reflects the steady rhythm of Christian discipleship rather than the heightened solemnity of seasons like Easter or Christmas. Simpler musical settings, moments of silence, and more restrained use of instruments can help the faithful enter into the quiet, ongoing work of daily conversion and holiness. This simplicity is not emptiness, but a reminder that the liturgy forms us not only through celebration, but also through faithful repetition and prayerful attentiveness.

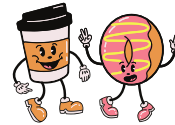
