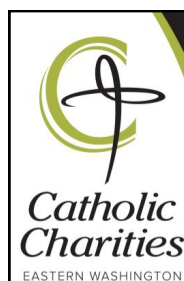

Sunday Reflection

Brothers and Sisters in Christ

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity! The mystery of the Holy Trinity is and always will be the central mystery of Christian believers and of Christian life. In the Catholic faith, the Trinity defines one God in three divine persons, God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Through our Faith we believe that this divine relationship is not three separate gods, yet one God who shares a single, undivided loving nature. The Trinity is not a challenge for us to fully understand this mystery, yet it is a personal invitation to be part of a shared relationship between us and a God that loves us.

This everlasting love for us is revealed to us in today's readings and Gospel. In the first reading, the Lord reveals to Moses that he is a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness. The second reading invites us to encourage one another, to live in peace and by doing so the God of love and peace will always be with us, and in the Gospel we hear the famous everlasting words: *"God so loved the world that he gave his only son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish, but might have eternal life."*

When we develop a lasting and loving relationship with God the Father, creator of everything, God the Son who lived among us, taught us about His Father's love and won for us eternal salvation and God the Holy Spirit who dwells in us and in the Church. This trinitarian love transforms our hearts, filling us with grace and enabling us to love one another as we are loved by God in three persons.

The Trinity is not just an abstract doctrine, yet it is a divine blueprint for human connection. As the Father, Son and Holy Spirit exist in perfect, self-giving harmony, so are we called to pour ourselves out for one another, in our families and our communities. When we live out this Triune love, we become reflections of who the Trinity represents.

May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and Communion of the Holy Spirit be with us all, now and forevermore. Amen
