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Sunday Reflection

Friends, at the core of our readings today is something astonishing about the heart of God: He is a God who sees, who feels, and who acts. From the very beginning, God has not wanted a distant relationship with His people. He has wanted a covenant of love, a bond so deep that He calls His people His *treasured possession*.

In the first reading from Exodus, God reminds Israel of what He has already done for them. He says, in essence, *"I saw your misery in Egypt, I heard your cries, I knew your suffering, and I came down to rescue you."* God does not ignore human pain. He does not look away. He does not remain neutral. He sees the misery of His people, and His heart is moved. And because His heart is moved, He sends Moses, an imperfect man, hesitant and unsure, yet chosen, to carry God's compassion into the suffering of His people.

In the Gospel, centuries later, the same God walks among His people in the flesh. And what does Matthew tell us? Jesus looks at the crowds, and His heart is *"moved with pity,"* because they are *"troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd."* The Greek word used here is *splagchnizomai* which means a gut-level compassion, a deep stirring of love. In other words, His compassion comes from deep within, His whole being aches for them. Just as God saw the misery of the Israelites in Egypt, Jesus sees the misery of the people in His own time: the sick, the confused, tired, the spiritually hungry, the forgotten, the overwhelmed.

And just as God sent Moses, Jesus sends the Twelve. He gives them authority to heal, to lift up, to proclaim the nearness of God. The pattern is unmistakable: God sees - God is moved - God sends. This is the rhythm of salvation history. This is the rhythm of God's love. And it continues today.

If we are to be honest, if Jesus were to walk into our city today, or our parish, our neighborhoods, our workplaces, what would He see? Would His reaction be any different? I don't think so because He would still see many people overwhelmed by anxiety, families stretched thin, young people searching for identity and belonging, elders longing not to be forgotten, communities divided and hurting, people carrying grief behind polite smiles, souls hungry for meaning, connection, and hope. And His heart would be moved with the same compassion. The human condition has not changed. The world still aches for healing, direction, hope and peace. But there is one difference: today, the ones He sends are us.

Just as Moses was sent to Israel, just as the Twelve were sent to the lost sheep of Israel, we are sent to the people of our time. Not because we are perfect. Not because we have all the answers. But because God's compassion needs hands, His mercy needs a voice, and His love needs a presence.

This is our identity, and our mission as disciples. God calls us His treasured possession not so we can sit comfortably, but so we can carry His mercy into the world. He heals us so we can become healers. He loves us so we can become instruments of His love and He sends us because the harvest is still abundant, and the laborers are still few.

So, the real question today is not, "What would Jesus do if He came today?" The real question is, "What will we do, since He has already come and has sent us?" Will we allow our hearts to be moved as His is moved? Will we see the suffering around us? Will we respond with compassion? Will we be the presence of Christ for those who feel troubled and abandoned?

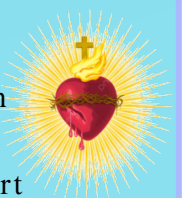
