THE CORNERSTONE: FAITH AND LEGACY

Upon attending the graduation ceremony for Chesterton Academy of Notre Dame this weekend, I was reminded by Senior Joseph Hartman in his speech of the enduring faith of Catholics throughout the ages.

I have had the opportunity to visit the Duomo in Milan, Italy, on a couple of occasions, and it is by far my favorite church in the world, yes, even more than St. Peter's Basilica.



What amazes me most are the people who built it. Those who laid its foundation and cornerstone in 1386 knew they would never see the cathedral completed, yet they built it anyway.

Although tremendous progress was made in the first sixteen years, with half of the structure completed, life unfolded, and work continued through the 19th and 20th centuries, including restorations and the completion of various details. The final completion was not realized until 1965, 579 years after construction began.

What kept them going for so long? Faith.

In Joey's speech, he said, "We are all laying the cornerstone for Catholic culture. We may never see a perfect Catholic society in our lifetime, but it is worth the effort in building it up for generations to come."

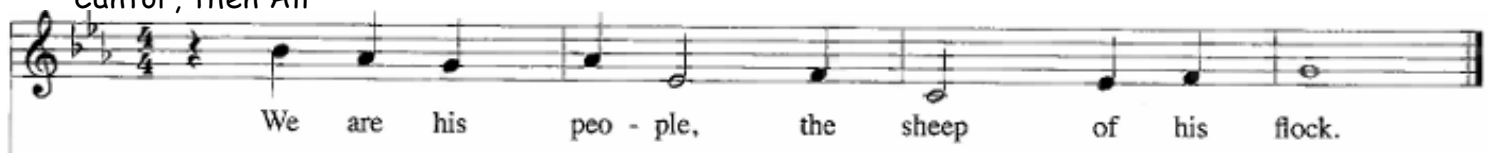

Today, as we leave the Easter Season and move to Ordinary Time, we will also change our Ordinary. It begs the question: What is the Ordinary? The Mass contains both the Ordinary and the Proper texts. The Ordinary consists of those parts that remain the same from week to week—such as the Gloria, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei—while the Proper includes texts that change according to the liturgical day or season, such as the Entrance Antiphon, Responsorial Psalm, and Communion Antiphon. Understanding this distinction helps us see how the Church balances continuity and variety, allowing the liturgy to express both the unchanging truths of the faith and the unique character of each celebration.

Lucia: I would like to ask you to take us to heaven.

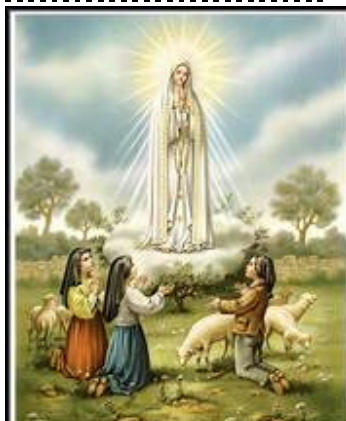
Our Lady: Yes, I shall take Jacinta and Francisco soon, but you will remain here for some time yet. Jesus wishes to use you in order to make me known and loved. He wishes to establish devotion to my Immaculate Heart in the world. I promise salvation to those who embrace it; and these souls will be beloved of God like flowers arranged by me to adorn His throne.

Lucia: Will I stay here alone?

Our Lady: No, daughter. Does that make you suffer much? Do not be dismayed. I will never forsake you. My Immaculate Heart shall be your refuge and the road that shall lead you to God.

Lucia writes, "Upon saying these last words, she opened her hands, and for the second time she communicated to us the reflection of that intense light. We could see ourselves in it, as if immersed in God. Jacinta and Francisco seemed to be in the part of this light that went up toward heaven, and I in the part that was cast toward the ground. In front of Our Lady's right hand there was a heart encircled by thorns that seemed to pierce it. We understood that it was the Immaculate Heart of Mary, insulted by the sins of humanity and which desires reparation." When this vision ceased, the Lady, still surrounded by the light that she radiated, rose from the little tree and glided toward the east until she disappeared completely. Several persons who were closer noticed that the buds at the top of the holm oak were bent in the same direction, as if they had been drawn by the Lady's clothes. They returned to their usual position only some hours later.

As we pray our Rosary let us find comfort in Mary's Immaculate Heart remembering that we are never alone. Our Lady of Fatima - Pray for us!

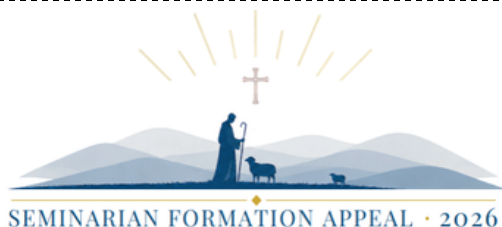

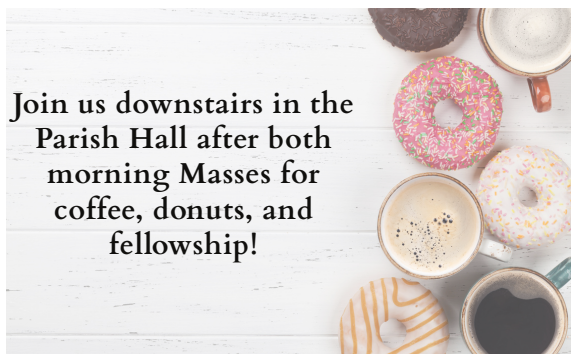
We are blessed beyond words to have 19 men currently discerning and pursuing the path to the priesthood, hoping one day to bring the hope of the Gospel to hearts that are restless and seeking God more deeply.

The journey to priesthood is a lengthy one. Formation can span up to nine years for a seminarian who begins at Cor Christi, continues his college studies at Bishop White Seminary, and completes theological studies at either Mount Angel Seminary in St. Benedict, Oregon; St. Patrick's Seminary in Menlo Park, California; or St. Francis de Sales Seminary in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

The cost of forming one seminarian over this nine-year period can exceed \$400,000. While the Annual Catholic Appeal provides substantial support for seminary formation, additional funding is needed. For this reason, the Seminarian Formation Appeal was established three years ago.

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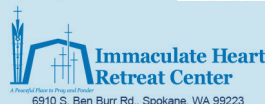
