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Sunday Reflection

Hospitality; The Only Proper Response to the Human Person

Friends, our readings for this 13th Sunday in Ordinary time are centered on the theme of hospitality. They all reveal that the human person is a gift, and the only proper response to a human person is welcome, acceptance, and love. In the first reading, the woman of Shunem sees the prophet Elisha passing by and responds not with hesitation but with generosity. She makes a room for him in her home and in her life. Her hospitality opens the door to God's blessing, the promise of a long-awaited child. In the Gospel, Jesus deepens this truth by teaching that whoever welcomes another in His name welcomes Him, and whoever welcomes Him welcomes the Father. Hospitality, then is not simply kindness it is participation in the very life of God.

This Shunammite woman teaches us something profound: hospitality begins with seeing the other person as worthy of care. Not because they earned it, not because they can repay it, but because they are human. This is why the Letter to the Hebrews tells us, "*Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by doing so some have entertained angels without knowing it.*" Every person who crosses our path is more than they appear. Every person carries a mystery. Every person bears the image of God. And sometimes, the ones we welcome become the very instruments of God's blessing in our lives.

In our daily lives, hospitality begins with the welcome we give to our own children, born and unborn, who deserve to be received with joy, protected with tenderness, and loved without condition. It continues in the fabric of family life, where patience, forgiveness, and presence become daily acts of hospitality. It extends into the Church, where no one should ever feel invisible or unworthy, and into society, where the elderly, the immigrant, the lonely, the poor, and the wounded must find in us a reflection of Christ's compassion. We live in a time when people are quick to build walls;

emotional walls, social walls, political walls. But the Gospel calls us to build tables instead. To make room, to open our hearts, to see Christ in the stranger, the visitor, the newcomer, the forgotten, the difficult, the different. Because if Hebrews is right and it is, then every time we welcome someone, we may be welcoming an angel. And every time we close our hearts, we may be closing the door on grace.

St. John Paul II reminded us in *Evangelium Vitae* that "*we have been entrusted to the care of one another by the Creator.*" We are not responsible only for the people we choose or those we plan for; we are responsible for all humanity because we are brothers and sisters. To welcome another in Jesus' name is to extend hospitality to Jesus Himself; "*Whoever receives you receives me,*" This means that every encounter becomes sacred, every person becomes a gift, and every act of welcome becomes an act of worship. Therefore, to follow Him is to make room for others. To love Him is to love those He sends. To receive Him is to receive the people He places in our lives.

And so, the question before us today is simple: Do we make room? Do we make room in our homes, our schedules, our parishes, and our hearts for the for the unborn child, the struggling teenager, the spouse who needs patience, the neighbor who is lonely, the stranger who is searching, the person who feels forgotten? Jesus tells us that the measure of our hospitality is the measure of our discipleship. Therefore, today let us ask for the grace to see hospitality not as a task, but as a way of life. To see every person as sacred. To respond with welcome, acceptance, and love. To remember that the stranger at our door may be the very presence of God. And may our homes, our parish, and our hearts become places where Christ Himself is always welcomed.
