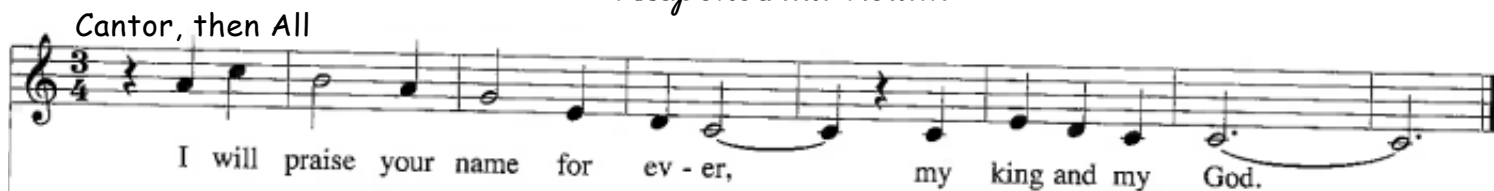
As our nation celebrates the 250th anniversary of the United States, we would be lacking in our celebration if we did not pause to give thanks for Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, the first U.S. citizen to be canonized a saint.

Mother Cabrini arrived in America in 1889, answering God's call with remarkable faith and obedience. Though her dream had been to serve as a missionary in China, she humbly accepted the Holy Father's request to come instead to the United States, where millions of immigrants longed not only for a better life but also for the hope of the Gospel. Through unwavering trust in God's providence, she founded 67 schools, hospitals, orphanages, and charitable institutions, bringing Christ's love to countless families and helping to build both the Catholic Church and our nation. Her life reminds us that holiness changes history. At a time when Catholics were often viewed with suspicion, Mother Cabrini demonstrated that faith inspires service, sacrifice, and love for neighbor. Her legacy continues to bless our country today through the countless lives touched by the ministries she began.

As we commemorate our nation's 250th birthday, may we also celebrate the witness of this remarkable saint who helped shape America's spiritual landscape. Let us ask for St. Frances Xavier Cabrini's intercession for our country, that we may grow in faith, charity, and unity. Finally, inspired by her courageous example of obedience to God's will and her unwavering faith, let us pray for an increase in religious vocations. May the Lord raise up generous men and women who, like Mother Cabrini, are willing to leave everything behind to proclaim the Gospel and serve His people with joyful hearts.

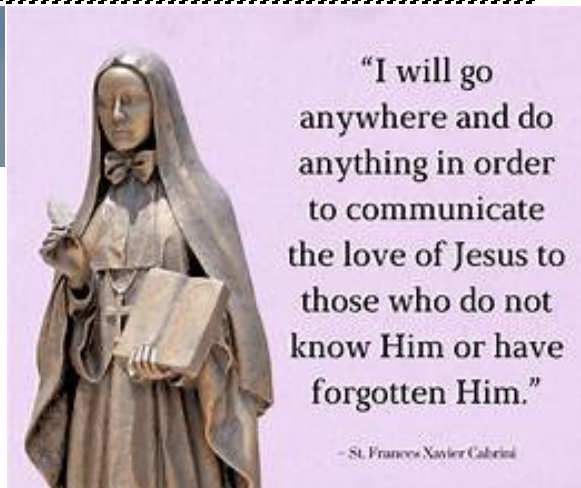
